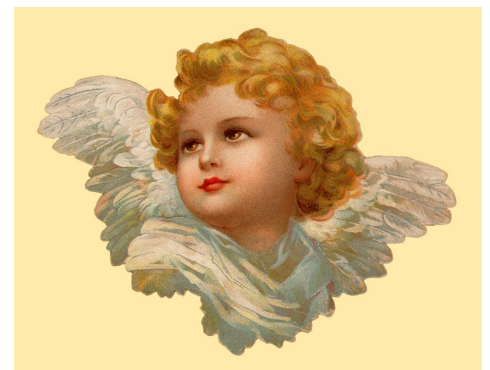

The Contributing Membership program is an annual program that recognizes three levels of support: US\$20, US\$50 and US\$100. Donations support our humanitarian efforts, with 100 percent of every contribution going to LCIF programs.



HOLIDAY GROCERY SHOPPING FOR DIABETICS

Dieticians and the American Diabetes Association recommend the following guidelines as we prepare for the Holiday Season:

1. Avoid foods high in saturated fats—i.e. butter, Crisco
2. Follow your "carbohydrate Prescription" - the amount of carbohydrates permitted in your meal plan
3. Eat a healthy diet—include a variety of fruits, vegetables and whole grains (all of these are carbohydrates)
4. Watch foods labeled as "sugar free". These foods can have as much carbohydrates as foods that are not sugar free
5. Watch "dietetic" labeling—you need to ask yourself, "How close to nature is this food product?" - Then make a choice.
6. Fried food labels—look for total carbohydrate grams; sugar grams; saturated fats.
7. Keep certain foods to minimum—sweets; salt (look for sodium free or low sodium products or use alternative flavors such as herbs and spices). Saturated and trans fats—limit prepackaged items, fried foods and skin on poultry
8. Use canola, peanut and olive oils instead of shortening, butter or margarine. You may have small portions of fat sources such as nuts and avocados.
